





FIG.1 - TYPICAL FORWARD CORRENT DERATING CURVE




FIG.2 - TYPICAL FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS




FIG.3 - MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE FORWARD SURGE CURRENT




FIG.4 - TYPICAL JUNCTION CAPACITANCE





FIG.5 - TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS





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
